01. Research the Organization

- Familiarize yourself with the company's mission, values, and culture. Review its official website, recent news articles, and social media profiles.
- Gain insights into the company's products, services, and market position. Demonstrating your knowledge about the organization shows genuine interest and commitment.

02. Understand the Role

03. Prepare for Common Interview Questions

- Use the **STAR method** (Situation, Task, Action, Result) to craft structured responses that effectively demonstrate your competencies.

04. Formulate Thoughtful Questions

- Interviews are a two-way conversation. Prepare insightful questions to ask the interviewer, such as:
 - “What growth opportunities does the company offer?”
 - “What challenges is the team currently addressing?”
 - “Can you describe the company culture?”

05. Exhibit Professional Etiquette

- Dress appropriately based on the company’s culture—whether business formal or business casual.
- Arrive 10–15 minutes early to demonstrate punctuality and respect.
- Maintain positive body language, make eye contact, offer a firm handshake, and smile to convey confidence.

06. Master Your Resume

- Whether the interview is in person, via phone, or through video conferencing, tailor your approach accordingly:
 - For **phone interviews**, focus on clear and concise communication.
 - For **video interviews**, ensure your technology is functional, your backdrop is professional, and your attire is appropriate.

10. Cultivate the Right Mindset

- Maintain a positive and confident outlook throughout the process. Remember, the interview is not only about the company evaluating you but also about determining whether the company aligns with your goals and values.
- Practice relaxation techniques, such as deep breathing, to manage nerves and remain composed.

Inaugural Session Highlights

- ❖ The conference opened with an inspiring inaugural session featuring speeches from distinguished speakers:

- ❖ **Skill Development and Education:** Presentations highlighted the role of teachers in vocational training, women's empowerment through innovation, and the synergy between NEP 2020 and AI in education.
- ❖ **Healthcare and Biotechnology:** Research ranged from AI-based diagnostics for neurological disorders to advancements in flow cytometry for medical analysis.
- ❖ **Entrepreneurship and Marketing:** Topics included digital marketing trends, the impact of generative AI on businesses, and strategies for talent management in various industries.

Each session fostered meaningful discussions and highlighted the interdisciplinary nature of addressing complex challenges in youth empowerment and skill development.

Fostering Innovation & Entrepreneurship









At Don Bosco Institute of Technology - BBA/B.Com(H) '24





INDUSTRY VISIT TO JOHNSON CONTROLS: Insights into the Order-To-Cash Process



HEALTH & WELLNESS TALK BY INDIA TODAY GROUP THE LALLANTOP SHOW

On 29th of August, 2024, a group of 36 students from Don Bosco Institute of Technology visited the Health and Wellness Program organized by the India Today Group.

The Lallantop's popular show "Sehat Adda" took a deep dive into India's health sector, offering expert insights on pressing medical issues. The third edition, and Delhi's second one till date, held at The Le Méridien Hotel in Delhi, featured nine sessions covering a wide range of health topics.

The event opened with a speech by The Lallantop's Founding Editor, Saurabh Dwivedi. Sessions included "Sehat, Swaad aur Swag," focusing on personalized diets and busting myths regarding different foods, and "Diet - Betes," highlighting diabetes management. Other sessions included "Soya Soya Jaga-Jaga Sa" which discussed the topic of sleep deprivation, "Cutting Age" about skin care and cancer risks, "Dil Ki Baat Dil Hi Jaane" related to heart health, "Smile Please" regarding dental care, "In Aankhon Ki..." with respect to eye health and "Long... Live ...Liver" in regard to liver wellness.

The discussions, led by experts, emphasized the importance of lifestyle changes, awareness, and preventive care to combat common health challenges in India. The final session, "Sex, Joy and Fear," addressed the need for open conversations about sexual health, trauma and therapy to overcome it, and the importance of touch in mental well-being, underscoring the broader societal implications of these topics.

Awareness of National Sports Day (Indoor Games & E-Sports)







The competition witnessed impressive submissions from various students, with a panel of judges selecting the most Profound works. The winners of the competition are:






Workshop Overview





The highlight of the workshop was its practical focus, which included:






The Educational Excursion to Dharamshala & Amritsar








Christmas Day Celebration for Faculty & Staff





GURU GYAN : SANCHAY EVAM SANCHAR

“Empowering Professionals in Emerging Technologies for Competency Building.”



In today's rapidly evolving technological landscape, professionals in higher education must stay updated to equip students with the skills to become future leaders, entrepreneurs, and agents of change. Recognizing this, Don Bosco Institute of Technology, Okhla, organized a one-week

Faculty Development Program (FDP) under the flagship banner Guru Gyan: Sanchay Evam Sanchar. The program, held from January 6–10, 2025, brought together 250 faculty members from across India to build competencies in emerging technologies through expert-led sessions.

The FDP featured 10 distinct sessions covering topics from business process re-engineering to strategic decision-making using business intelligence.

Session 1: Emerging Trends and Future Business Process Re-engineering by Prof. (Dr.) Rama Krishna Y, IPE Hyderabad.

This session introduced the fundamentals of Business Process Re-engineering (BPR), highlighting its lifecycle and its role in boosting organizational efficiency. Prof. Rama Krishna explored future trends like Artificial Intelligence (AI) and automation, demonstrating how these technologies are reshaping business processes to meet evolving market demands.

Session 2: Cyber Security Threats and Counter Measures by Dr. Naveen Kumar, IIT Vadodara

Dr. Naveen Kumar emphasized the growing cybersecurity challenges due to the global dependence on internet-based applications. He discussed real-world examples, such as the BSNL data breach and AIIMS ransomware attack, and explored web threats like information leakage and SQL injection. Solutions such as anti-phishing software, DNS filtering, and Zerodium were proposed to mitigate these risks.

Session 3: AI Applications in Marketing and Customer Experience Management, by Dr. Varun Srivastava, JIIT Deemed University Noida

Dr. Srivastava highlighted the transformative role of AI in marketing and customer engagement. By leveraging predictive analytics, personalization, and automation, businesses can enhance customer experiences and design more effective marketing strategies, ultimately driving growth and satisfaction.

Session 4: Cybersecurity and Ethical Hacking for Professionals by Dr. Anup Girdhar, Sedulity Solutions and Technologies

In this session, Dr. Girdhar addressed the shift from a device-centric era to a data-centric era, underscoring the role of AI in cybersecurity. The discussion included risks associated with devices like Alexa and Siri, the importance of tools such as VPNs, and the practical use of the CEIR dashboard for cybercrime reporting. Key distinctions between vulnerability and penetration testing were also elaborated upon.

Session 5: Sustainability Through Emerging Technologies in Management by Prof. (Dr.) Pankaj Kumar Gupta, Jamia Millia Islamia

This session highlighted how disruptive technologies like AI and IoT contribute to sustainability goals. Dr. Gupta emphasized the integration of value chains—both horizontal and vertical—to address pressing global challenges such as climate change and economic inequality, showcasing the potential of technology-driven solutions.

Session 6: Trust Management in IoT by Dr. Karan Singh, JNU New Delhi

Dr. Singh discussed trust management in IoT systems, focusing

on trust models and evaluation methods. He provided actionable recommendations for improving trust in IoT ecosystems, such as implementing encryption, layered security, device updates, and user education, which are critical for fostering reliable IoT environments.

Session 7: AI for Social Welfare by Prof. (Dr.) P.S. Grover, Former Professor at DU

Prof. Grover demonstrated the societal benefits of AI in addressing challenges in healthcare, education, and environmental sustainability. He emphasized AI's potential in advancing the UN's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by promoting social good and improving quality of life.
