SENTIENT SHIELDS: THE RISE OF AI-POWERED CYBER DEFENCE IN A QUANTUM WORLD

The era of firewalls and antivirus software is no longer relevant in cybersecurity. These days, defensive systems are needed to think, learn, and change in tandem with the threats they are designed to counter. The need for equally clever defences has never been greater as cyberattacks get more sophisticated and self-governing. This is a revolution in cybersecurity, and not merely a change.

Cybersecurity as a Living System

Forget the castle-and-moat analogy. Cybersecurity today is more like a living organism—adaptive, interconnected, and self-aware. It evolves in real time, guided by data, artificial intelligence, and predictive modelling. Innovations now allow systems to pre-empt attacks before they happen, quarantine threats without human intervention, and even analyse attacker intent.

Game-Changing Innovations in Cyber Defense

- Security algorithms that mimic the human brain to identify trends and abnormalities are known as neuro-inspired algorithms
- Synthetic Cyber Environments: Building virtual battlefields to test systems against incredibly realistic assaults. Similar to our human immune system, digital immune systems use behavioral analytics and machine learning to identify and eliminate threats.
- AI Cyber Co-Pilots are embedded AI assistants who work with IT teams to automate countermeasures, examine logs, and recommend repairs.

Cybersecurity's Quantum Leap

- **Post-Quantum Cryptography:** Preparing for a future where quantum computers can crack today's encryption in minutes.
- Quantum Key Distribution (QKD): Harnessing quantum physics to secure data transmission with unbreakable encryption.

Emerging Cyber Frontiers

- Augmented Reality (AR) Threat Visualization: Allowing security analysts to "see" threats in immersive environments.
- **Predictive Governance Engines:** All systems that proactively enforce regulatory compliance across hybrid environments.
- **Cybersecurity Mesh Architecture (CSMA):** A distributed approach to enforcing security across multi-cloud and remote work setups.

Real-World Pioneers

- **AI-Secured Satellites:** Space agencies are using autonomous cybersecurity to protect satellite constellations from nation-state hackers.
- Smart Grids with Cyber Reflexes: Power utilities have adopted digital twins and self-healing networks to stop outages before they begin.
- Voiceprint Security: Some financial institutions now use vocal biometrics as a defense against deepfake fraud.

Challenges in the New Age

- AI vs AI: Cybercriminals now use generative AI to create advanced phishing campaigns and polymorphic malware.
- Data Ethics and Sovereignty: With great data comes great responsibility. Ensuring ethical use of AI in security is a must.
- Talent Bottleneck: There's a global shortage of cyber defenders who can think creatively and leverage these advanced tools.

We're moving toward **sentient security**—systems that understand context, anticipate user behaviour, and co-exist with human teams as intelligent allies. Think of them as guardians that never sleep, evolve with each attack, and grow smarter by the second.







A Workshop on Campus to Corporate – Bridging the Gap

On February 6, 2025, Don Bosco Institute of Technology (DBIT), Delhi hosted an insightful workshop titled "Campus to Corporate," conducted by Ms. Aisha Ghani, a Certified Happiness Coach. The session was designed to help final-year students from BBA, BCA, and B.Com (Hons.) programs to have a smooth transition from student life to the professional world by bridging the gap between education and workplace expectations.

The workshop emphasized on the essential skills such as confidence, communication, and leadership, with a special focus on Emotional Intelligence (EI) as a key driver of career success. Rather than relying on traditional lectures, Ms. Aisha adopted an interactive approach, encouraging discussions to actively engage students.

A striking revelation shared during the workshop was that only 5% of students land in their dream jobs. To improve these odds, Ms. Aisha highlighted the importance of developing strong communication skills. In a bold move to challenge students, she randomly invited participants to speak about themselves on the stage, unveiling three distinct reactions: excitement, nervousness, and fear. The activity aimed to increase students' self-awareness and help them conquer their anxieties.

One of the highlights of the session was the introduction of the Venn diagram method for career selection. This technique guides students in identifying potential career paths by considering four elements: what they love, what the world needs, what they can get paid for, and what they are good at. Additionally, the common fear of public speaking, known as glossophobia, was addressed with practical solutions like Neuro-Linguistic Programming (NLP) and Systematic Desensitization, both of which help reduce anxiety through gradual exposure.

The workshop also delved into skill-building, interview preparation, and career adaptability. A captivating concept discussed was "Where is the Tiger Hiding?" — a metaphor for adapting to unexpected changes in the professional landscape. Furthermore, students were introduced to the Recruitment Competency Framework, which illustrates how companies assess candidates based on skills, leadership potential, and cultural fit.

The session concluded with the announcement of a mentorship program aimed at helping students build confidence and prepare for their careers, marking a promising step forward for those ready to embrace the corporate world.

A Guest Lecture by the Delhi Productivity Council on Ideas to Impact and Protect Intellectual Property for Competitive Startups



Closing Ceremony & Prize Distribution:





Day 1: Foundation of Generative AI

The workshop kicked off with an introductory session by Dr. Amit Arjun Verma, Senior R&D Manager (GUVI-HCL), and Karthick Thangadurai, and Data Scientist [GUVI-HCL] who underscored the transformative role of AI in modern technology.

The key focus was on the role of Python in AI development, particularly its powerful libraries like Hugging Face Transformers, which simplify the implementation of complex models. Students put theory into practice by writing Python scripts for text processing on Google Colab, gaining first-hand experience in AI-driven automation. To reinforce learning, interactive quizzes tested participants' grasp of AI concepts. The session also covered fine-tuning Large Language Models (LLMs) for custom applications.

Day 2: Advanced Implementation & Deployment

The second day shifted focus to collaborative development and scalable AI solutions. Participants learned the essentials of Git and GitHub, including repository creation and version control—a must-have skill for AI teamwork. The highlight was a deep dive into Retrieval-Augmented Generation (RAG), led by Karthick Thangadurai. Attendees explored how RAG combines retrieval models with generative LLMs to


produce accurate, context-aware responses. This knowledge was put to the test as participants built their Q&A chatbot using RAG frameworks. The workshop also addressed deployment and scaling challenges.

The event wrapped up with closing remarks from Hariprasad Kodamana, Chairperson, Anup Singh. Co-Chairperson and Sumit Singh Overall Coordinator of Tryst'25. Experts encouraged participants to harness generative AI to solve pressing global challenges.


Technical Session IV – Sustainable Business Practices






