

The **SECOND** International Conference on Indian Knowledge Systems Highlights India's Journey Towards Becoming a **VISHWA GURU**



The Second International Conference on “*Perspectives of the Indian Knowledge System (IKS) in Making India a Vishwa Guru*” was successfully held on 26 July 2025 at Don Bosco Institute of Technology (DBIT), Delhi, on hybrid mode. This academic International Conference brought together academicians, professionals, research scholars, experts, and students to explore how India’s ancient knowledge traditions can meaningfully address contemporary global challenges.

The conference was graced by Prof. Dhananjay Joshi, Former Vice-Chancellor of Delhi Teachers University, as the Chief Guest and Keynote Speaker. The event also witnessed the presence of eminent Guests of Honour from leading institutions, including GGSIPU, NSUT, Jamia Millia Islamia, IIT Delhi, IGNOU, and International Universities. The leadership and support of Rev. Prof. Sajjan M. George, Chairman of DBIT, Prof. Vikas Rao Vadi, Director of DBIT, and Rev. Fr. Biju Kokar, Chief Finance Officer, DBIT, played a vital role in the smooth organization of the event.

Distinguished Guest Discussions

Prof. Vijita Singh Aggarwal, Director of International Affairs, GGSIPU, highlighted the growing global interest in Indian Knowledge Systems and emphasized the role of international collaborations in positioning IKS as a credible and valuable contributor to global academia. She spoke on integrating IKS within international curricula and research exchanges.

Prof. Azhar Kazmi, Former Visiting Professor of Management at King Fahd University of Petroleum & Minerals, Saudi Arabia, shared insights on how Indian philosophical principles can enrich modern management practices. Drawing from his international teaching experience, he stressed ethical leadership, sustainability, and long-term value creation inspired by Indian wisdom.

Prof. Amit Prakash Singh, USICT, GGSIPU, discussed the relevance of IKS in technology-driven education. He emphasized aligning emerging technologies such as artificial intelligence and data science with ethical frameworks rooted in Indian knowledge traditions to ensure responsible innovation.

Prof. C.S. Sharma, Professor Emeritus, Department of Management Studies, NSUT, reflected on the timeless managerial insights found in Indian scriptures. He underlined how concepts from the *Arthashastra* and *Bhagavad Gita* remain relevant for decision-making, governance, and organizational leadership today.

Prof. Ravi K. Dhar, Director, Ashok Sawhney Foundation, spoke on the social and developmental dimensions of IKS. He emphasized community-centric growth, inclusive development, and the importance of value-based education in achieving sustainable societal progress.

Prof. N.H. Mullik, Department of Management Studies, Jamia Millia Islamia, highlighted the application of Indian ethical frameworks in contemporary business and management education. He advocated for blending traditional wisdom with modern pedagogical practices to create socially responsible professionals.

Prof. Subodh Kesharwani, Chief Vigilance Officer, IGNOU, discussed governance, transparency, and accountability through the lens of Indian ethical traditions. He emphasized how ancient principles can strengthen integrity and ethical conduct in modern institutional systems.

Prof. Mansaf Alam, Department of Computer Science, Jamia Millia Islamia, explored the intersection of IKS with computer science. He highlighted opportunities to embed Indian logical and philosophical frameworks into artificial intelligence, machine learning, and computational thinking.

Prof. Vivek Kumar, Head, CRDT, IIT Delhi, and National Coordinator, UBA, emphasized the role of IKS in rural development and community engagement. He shared insights on how traditional knowledge can support sustainable technologies and grassroots innovation under national development initiatives.

Institutional Leadership Perspectives

Rev. Prof. Sajjan M. George, Chairman of DBIT, emphasized the institute’s commitment to nurturing value-based education rooted in Indian traditions. He highlighted DBIT’s vision of blending academic excellence with ethical and cultural grounding to prepare socially responsible global citizens.



Prof. Vikas Rao Vadi, Director of DBIT, spoke on the importance of academic platforms like this conference in bridging tradition and modernity. He emphasized interdisciplinary research, innovation, and institutional responsibility in promoting Indian Knowledge Systems within contemporary education frameworks.

Inspired by the Sanskrit shloka “विद्या ददाति विनयं”, the conference emphasized the transformative power of knowledge in nurturing humility, values, and holistic well-being. The inaugural ceremony began with a prayer song followed by the ceremonial lighting of the lamp by the Chief Guest and other dignitaries. Eminent speakers stressed the revival of Indian Knowledge Systems and their integration into modern education, science, and policy frameworks, aligning with the vision of making India a *Vishwa Guru* by 2047. A total of 108 research papers were presented, including 5 International submissions from Canada, Germany, and Ethiopia, reflecting the growing global interest in IKS.

The academic deliberations were organized into three technical sessions. **Technical Session I**, chaired by **Prof. (Dr.) Ajai Pal Sharma** and **Prof. (Dr.) Ganesh Kumar Wadhvani**, focused on the integration of IKS with management and technology and benefited 40 participants. Papers explored themes such as financial sustainability through traditional credit systems, organizational behaviour, blockchain-based data privacy, and applications of the *Bhagavad Gita* and *Arthashastra* in resilience and economic thought, along with IKS-based optimization of large language models.

Technical Session II, chaired by **Prof. (Dr.) Md. Shahnawaz Abdin**, engaged 45 participants and examined the blending of ancient wisdom with FinTech, artificial intelligence, ESG frameworks, and pedagogy. Key discussions included behavioural psychology in FinTech adoption, indigenous financial wisdom for entrepreneurs, digital finance aligned with ESG principles, the role of IKS in NEP 2020, corporate lessons from IKS, and insights from *Vedanga Jyotisha*.

Technical Session III, chaired by **Dr. Raj Kumar**, involved 18 participants and focused on cross-disciplinary applications of IKS in technology, healthcare, education, and sustainability. Papers highlighted the use of AI and machine learning in civil engineering and healthcare, mindfulness for sustainable hospitality, Gurukul-based education models, fraud detection and medical diagnostics through machine learning, and the role of IKS in vocational education under NEP 2020.

Overall, the conference reinforced India’s vision of becoming a *Vishwa Guru* through value-based and sustainable knowledge systems. It fostered interdisciplinary research, encouraged policy and curriculum reforms, and strengthened academic and research collaborations. The conference concluded with a collective commitment to keep Indian Knowledge Systems alive, dynamic, and globally relevant, laying a strong foundation for India’s emergence as a global knowledge leader.

Guest Lecture on “Converting Innovation into Startups” EMPOWERS FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS



Seminar-Cum-Workshop on Artificial Intelligence by HCL GUVI

On 11 December 2025, a seminar-cum-workshop on Artificial Intelligence was organized at Don Bosco Institute of Technology (DBIT), Delhi, in collaboration with HCL GUVI. The session was conducted by two distinguished speakers: Dr. Jatin Chhokra, Deputy Manager- Consumer and Institution at HCL GUVI and Dr. Vinodhini Rajamanickam, a Data Science Specialist at HCL GUVI.

The workshop aimed to introduce students to modern AI concepts, demonstrate practical applications, and inspire them to explore AI-driven innovation in their respective fields. The workshop began with an introduction to AI and its role in the transformation of technology across industries. The speakers explained how AI is reshaping business processes, decision-making, and user experiences. Then they moved to an introduction to Generative AI, presenting it as a new and exciting area where machines can create text, images, and other content based on learned patterns. This helped students understand how GenAI differs from traditional rule-based or predictive systems.

Another important part of the seminar was on developing web software with AI, where the speakers discussed how AI can be integrated into web applications to enhance functionality, personalization, and automation.

This was followed by a session on prompt engineering, where students learned how to design effective prompts to get accurate and meaningful responses from AI models. The topic of deep learning was also covered, and it was explained in a very simple manner using Teachable Machine, which made complex concepts easy to grasp. The workshop was highly interactive, with continuous question-and-answer sessions and clear, guided explanations. One of the most engaging activities was the live training of an AI model to recognize faces.

Students observed how images are captured, how a model is trained, and how it learns to distinguish between different faces. This hands-on activity made the entire learning experience very practical and memorable.

As a student participant, I found the seminar to be very innovative and a new experience. The workshop was thrilling, as it introduced many concepts that were previously only heard about in theory. Being able to see AI models working in real time and understanding the logic behind them created a strong interest in exploring AI further.

The overall students' response was positive, with many participants expressing that they had learned new things from the workshop and felt motivated to apply these ideas in their future studies and projects. In conclusion, the seminar by HCL GUVI, led by Dr. Jatin Chhokra and Dr. Vinodhini Rajamanickam, successfully combined theory, demonstration, and hands-on activity. It made complex AI topics understandable and exciting for students from non-technical as well as technical backgrounds, and it provided a strong foundation and inspiration to continue learning about Artificial Intelligence.



An overview of the 10 sessions.S

Session 1: AI Usage in the Academic State of Affairs by Prof. Subodh Kesharwani Chief Vigilance Officer, School of Management Studies, IGNOU, New Delhi The session provided an overview of the evolving academic ecosystem influenced by AI. It highlighted institutional readiness, policy implications, and the strategic integration of AI tools in higher education.

Session 2: Understanding AI and Its Role in Education by Prof. Md. Shahnawaz Abdin from SMBS, Jamia Hamdard. This session focused on the fundamentals of Artificial Intelligence and its transformative role in education. It emphasized conceptual clarity and the pedagogical shift enabled by AI-driven learning environments.

Session 3: AI Tools for Student Engagement by Dr. Md. Abdul Matheen Academic Coordinator, Saudi Electronic University, Riyadh The speaker discussed on, various AI-powered tools designed to enhance student engagement. The session demonstrated how adaptive learning platforms and intelligent systems improve participation and personalized learning.

Session 4: on Multimedia & Visual Content Creation with AI by Dr. Harshita Tuli Sikroria Deputy Head (AI-ML), Lloyd Institute of Engineering & Technology, Greater Noida. This session explored AI-based tools for creating multimedia and visual academic content. It showcased innovative methods for developing interactive teaching materials and digital resources using AI.

Session 5: on AI in Assessment & Evaluation by Prof. Tapan Kumar Gandhi, Head of the Department of Biomedical Engineering, IIT Delhi. The session highlighted the role of AI in modern assessment practices. It covered automated evaluation systems, data-driven assessment models, and fairness in AI-supported evaluations.

Session 6: on AI for Feedback, Grading & Learning Analytics by Prof. Mansaf Alam from the Department of Computer Science, Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi. This session focused on AI-enabled feedback mechanisms, grading systems, and learning analytics. It demonstrated how data insights can improve instructional strategies and learner outcomes.



Session 7: on AI Tools for Research & Academic Writing, by Prof. Prakash Singh, from Saudi Electronic University, Riyadh

The speaker discussed AI tools that assist in research planning, literature review, academic writing, and plagiarism checks. The session emphasized ethical and effective use of AI in scholarly research.

Session 8: on AI Tools for Academic Administration & Documentation, by Prof. N. H. Mallick, from the Department of Management, Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi. This session covered AI applications in academic administration, documentation, and institutional workflows. It highlighted efficiency enhancement, automation, and decision support systems in educational institutions.

Session 9: on AI Ethics, Safety & Institutional Guidelines by Prof. Anuradha Jain, Principal, VIPS, GGSIP University. The session emphasized ethical considerations, safety concerns, and the formulation of institutional AI guidelines. It stressed responsible AI adoption aligned with academic integrity and regulatory frameworks. Last Session 10: on Capstone Project Presentations by Dr. Rekha Dahiya Associate Professor, B. R. Ambedkar University

Participants presented capstone projects focusing on theoretical frameworks, conceptual understanding, and critical analysis of AI applications in teaching, research, and academic administration. The session highlighted the attainment of key learning outcomes of the FDP. The Valedictory Session marked the successful culmination of the FDP, highlighting key learnings and acknowledging the valuable contributions of all resource persons and participants. A SEMINAR ON 'FINANCIAL LITERACY'



On 16 January 2026, Don Bosco Institute of Technology, Delhi, organized an informative and motivating financial literacy seminar for girls' students in collaboration with Mirae Asset Mutual Fund. The seminar was specially conducted for the girls of BBA, BCA & B.Com (Hons.). The session was led by Dr. D. D. Raj Shrivastava, EX Banker (SBI) who shared valuable knowledge about money management, financial planning, and the importance of financial independence for women.

The main purpose of the seminar was to make young girls aware of financial literacy and to help them understand how important it is to manage their own money. Dr. Shrivastava explained that financial literacy is not only about earning money but also about saving, spending wisely, and investing for the future. He said that financial knowledge helps girls feel confident, secure, and prepared for every stage of life.

During the session, Dr. Shrivastava emphasized that women are expert money managers. He explained that women naturally know how to plan household expenses, manage budgets, and save money for future needs. However, he also pointed out that many women still depend on others for financial decisions. He encouraged students to break this habit and take full responsibility for their financial choices.

A very important part of the seminar was the explanation of the three D's of financial planning. Dr. Shrivastava explained each point in a simple and relatable manner.

The first D is Dream, which means setting clear goals such as higher education, career growth, starting a business, or personal security.

The second D is Discipline, which means saving and investing money regularly without skipping.


The third D is Diversification, which means investing money in different options so that risk can be reduced and returns can be balanced.

The speaker also discussed different saving and investment options, especially mutual funds and Systematic Investment Plans (SIPs). He explained how SIPs allow people to invest small amounts regularly and how starting early helps money grow faster through the power of compounding. These examples helped students understand that even college students can begin their financial journey with small savings.

Another important message of the seminar was not to depend on anyone for financial needs. Dr. Shrivastava clearly stated that financial independence gives women freedom, confidence, and decision-making power. He encouraged women to always maintain an emergency fund and plan for long-term financial security.

The seminar was highly interactive and engaging. Students actively participated and asked many questions related to savings, investments, career opportunities in finance, and personal financial planning. Dr. Shrivastava answered all the questions patiently and motivated students to take a serious interest in managing their finances.

Online Seminar on “From Ideas to Careers – Applying Lean Startup and MVP Strategies for Professional Growth”

The Department of CS/IT, Don Bosco Institute of Technology, Delhi, conducted an online expert session titled “From Ideas to Careers: Applying Lean Startup and MVP Strategies for Professional Growth,” delivered by Prof. R. Chadha, Director at Landmark. The session focused on helping students convert academic learning and early-stage ideas into credible career pathways by borrowing principles from the Lean Startup method and Minimum Viable Product (MVP) thinking.


Prof. Chadha opened with an overview of the Lean Startup mindset—starting small, validating assumptions quickly, and using feedback loops to refine both products and personal career plans. He encouraged students to treat their profiles like evolving “products”: identify a hypothesis (career goal), build an MVP (a small but demonstrable project or portfolio), measure outcomes (interviews, recruiter feedback, user metrics), and iterate rapidly. Examples included capstone projects turned into GitHub-hosted prototypes, concise case studies on Kaggle or Hugging Face, and structured reflection to show measurable impact.

Linking this framework to current industry needs, the speaker mapped the Scope of AI/ML and Data Science in the industry. He outlined typical roles (Data Analyst, ML Engineer, MLOps Engineer, Applied Scientist) and the skill stack expected at each level—data handling, statistics, model development, deployment, and ethics/compliance.

The session concluded with an interactive Q&A, where students sought clarity on project selection, exam readiness, and choosing between immediate employment and higher studies.
